

Elysée — design Pierre Paulin, 2009



This shelving system is the second project by Pierre Paulin for Magis, which was launched on the market in 2009 as the low chair Flower, after a long project development started in 2003.

In the 70s Pierre Paulin was commissioned to fit out the living, dining, smoking and exhibition rooms of the private apartments for the President Pompidou at the Elysée Palace.

Starting from the project of a shelving system he designed on that occasion Pierre Paulin later developed Elysée for Magis, a modular shelving system available in maple

plywood (natural or stained black), allowing an endless series of compositions.




Pierre Paulin
